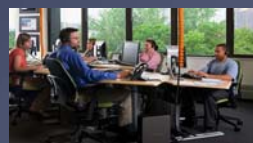

- * 1979: Founded to work on solar energy and conservation
- * 1980s: expanded to environmental issues- pollution prevention, waste management and hazardous waste
- * 1991: Started working on land use issues
- * 1993: Energy Aware Planning Guide, updated in 2009
- * 1997: Annual New Partners for Smart Growth conference

AN ALLIANCE TO SUPPORT LOCAL GOVERNMENT

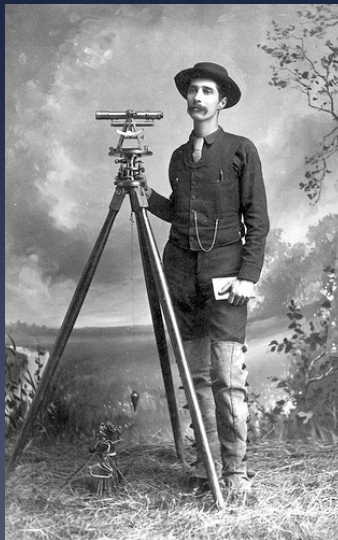
