HB's EECBG Activities

- Large scale municipal solar feasibility & entitlements followed Solar PPA
- GIS based streetlight audit (in-house)
- LED street and area lights (in-house)
- Energy Efficiency Retrofits in gov't facilities (Unbundled performance contract)



Other city's approaches

- PACE related programs
- Recycling
- Renewables
- Deferred maintenance – past end of useful life limited incentives
